- **Incredible Years® Experience parenting program.** It is a 12-week researched based program using group discussion, practice opportunities, goal setting, problem solving, home activities and networking to help strengthen the relationship between parents/caretakers and their child(ren). There is no cost to participants and childcare is available. Please call 660/216-7332 for more information or to register.
- **Project THRIVE**, a collaborative, community-based initiative working towards strengthening families by linking them with resources to meet specific needs. Project THRIVE works with families experiencing high levels of stress. Once a family completes a referral form, a representative will be in contact with the family within three business days after the referral is received. A Project THRIVE staff will link the family with resources to meet specific needs (i.e. home visits, parent education, etc.) and resources through flex funding to address unmet needs (i.e. transportation, co-payments, specific housing or family issues to prevent escalating crises, etc.) Eligible families may receive Parent-Child Interaction Therapy (PCIT), a short-term, specialized behavior management program for young children experiencing behavioral and/or emotional difficulties. PCIT works with the child and caregiver to improve overall behavior and reduce parenting stress. PCIT is designed for children ages 2- 7 years old. Project THRIVE is a free and voluntary program. Hospice provides care that is focused on helping families cope with what people fear most about dying - being in pain, being alone, losing control, and being a burden to others. Services are provided by a medically supervised interdisciplinary team of professionals and volunteers.

Hospice services are available in both the home and inpatient setting. Home care is provided on a part-time, intermittent, regularly scheduled and around-the-clock on-call basis. Bereavement services are available to the family for up to one year after the patient dies. Admission is on the basis of patient and family need with approval of their attending physician and the Hospice medical director.

This help may include: rental assistance, security deposits, utility payments including payments in arrears, and temporary motel expenses. To qualify for this assistance, applicants must provide documentation of homelessness or threat of homelessness such as an eviction notice, utility turnoff notice or other documentation of homeless status. Income eligibility guidelines also apply.

Applicants should call Ruby Doss at (660) 627-5400 and leave a message on her voice mail including contact information. Ms. Doss is not in the office every day, so it may take several days for her to return calls.
